The Height of the Storm

The action takes place in the present day. It is late summer, in the Normandy village home of André and Madeleine. Their daughters, Anne and Élise, are visiting for the weekend.

Scene 1 Saturday morning
Scene 2 Saturday afternoon
Scene 3 Sunday morning
Epilogue Sunday afternoon

Characters, in order of appearance:

Anne – the daughter

André – the father

Madeleine – the mother

Élise – the younger daughter

A woman

A man

Run time 1 hour 50 mins including a 20-min interval between scenes 2 and 3

The author

Florian Zeller is France's foremost contemporary playwright, best known for his plays about family relationships. His most successful play, *The Father* (2012), was made into a film in 2020, starring Anthony Hopkins and Olivia Coleman. Zeller is also a successful novelist.

The translator

Christopher Hampton, who collaborated with Zeller on the screenplay for *The Father* is known for his own theatrical work, including *The Philanthropist* and *Sunset Boulevard*, for his translations of *The God of Carnage* and *Dangerous Liaisons*, and for his screenplays, which include *Atonement*.

The Father won a BAFTA and an Academy Award for Best Adapted Screenplay.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I have long been a fan of the work of Florian Zeller. I saw his powerful drama *The Mother* in 2010 and soon after had the chance to see *The Father*, his moving study of ageing. Eager for more, I saw his entertaining comedies *Truth* and *The Lie*, which demonstrate his enormous versatility as a writer. *The Height of the Storm* exhibits characteristics of all of these.

The title of the play comes from a poem by René Char, a French poet and member of the Resistance:

At the height of the storm There's always a bird to reassure us, The unknown bird: It sings and then it flies away.

Even in life's most difficult moments, comfort can be found, sometimes from unexpected sources. This play shows us a family dealing with ageing, dementia and death, but in a way that challenges our thinking about reality and the accuracy of memory.

As Zeller says, 'The play makes different scenarios cohabit ... The challenge for the director is to make it clear at each moment which scenario is being enacted. This takes the spectator on a dream-like journey through the multiple possibilities of the end of life.'

We hope you enjoy it.
